## After legal session, commission no longer focusing solely on IVGID ops

he portion of Tuesday's Washoe County Commission meeting intended to address alleged Incline Village General Improvement District misconduct has been modified in response to legal concerns posed by district lawyers.

Originally, the agenda item for Tuesday's meeting in Reno was designed to allow IVGID representatives a chance to address concerns posed by residents to Commission Chairwoman Marsha Berkbigler, whose district includes Incline Village.

However, IVGID General Manager Ste Pinkerton has stated that he, along with

# XTERRA challenges, rewards

Over 150 triathletes take to scenic Flume Trail above east shore

#### HERE MAY NOT BE A FINER **OFF-ROAD TRIATHLON COURSE IN THE COUNTRY.**

More than 150 people took advantage in the scenic and challenging XTERRA Lake Tahoe on Saturday.

Racing on the former XTERRA National Championships course, the event began with a 1,500-meter (long course) or 750-meter (short course) swim off the shore of Incline Village.

It then sent competitors up Tunnel Creek on their mountain bikes and onto the Flume Trail, where they were treated to jaw-dropping views above North America's largest alpine lake.

After the 22-mile bike - the same distance for both the long and short course athletes finished with a relatively flat 6-mile or 3-mile run through Incline Village.

Reno resident Matthew Balzer, 34, took the win in a field of 109 participants in the long-course triathlon, posting a time of 2:49:41. He was followed by 19-year-old David Duncan (3:02:25) and 33-year-old Donatas Ereminas of Truckee, who finished

Wayne Best (3:08:51) and Nathan Brown (3:13:34) rounded out the top five.

In the women's field, Janet Soule, 53, of Davis claimed the win while finishing 22nd overall in 3:36:57. Soule placed second in the Donner Lake Triathlon Half-Ironman distance last month.

Soule was followed by Kimberly Larson, who was 38th overall (3:50:12), and Heather Horton, who was 58th (4:06:32).

Hometowns were not listed on the results.

In a field of 45 racers, Stefan Laursen, 45, claimed the victory in the short-course triathlon with a time of 2:44:35. That was

just one second faster than Marc Rancourt, 43, of Incline Village (2:44:36). Joey Figone, 41, was third (2:45:46).

Samantha Shields, 44, topped the women's field and was eighth overall with a time of 2:57:33, and Shaena Berlin, 24, finished runner-up among women and 13th overall (3:03:22).

Dorea Shoemaker (3:06:53) and Sarah McMahan (3:07:26), both of Incline Village, finished third and fourth, respectively.

### Supported mountain bike ride

Lake Tahoe's Most Beautiful Trail Ride, the area's first and only fully supported mountain bike ride, will take place above the East Shore on Saturday, Aug. 29. The scenic and challenging course starts at Spooner Lake and continues up to Marlette Lake and the Flume Trail. It then connects with Tunnel Creek Road for a descent to Tunnel Creek Café. It covers a total of 14 miles and climbs 1,100 feet. The ride — not a race — is offered as a fully supported event, which includes transportation to the start, aid stations, course marshals, bike patrol, and post-ride nourishment and party. Proceeds from the event will go to Tahoe Area Mountain Bike Association (TAMBA), the Incline Bike Project (www. Incline BikeProject.org) and Nevada State Parks. Registration through Aug. 15 is \$48 per adult and \$36 per child. Cost is \$54 per dult after Aug. 15. Children under 10 years old are free. #### Castle Peak 100K

The inaugural Castle Peak 100K is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 29. The point-topoint race, put on by the Donner Party

#### **Baseball field dedication**

The North Tahoe Public Utility District has partnered with the Placer County Deputy Sheriff's Association to rename Ball Field No. 2 in the North Tahoe Regional Park "Placer County Detective Mike Davis, Jr. Field." Detective Davis was killed while on duty in October 2014. He had been an employee at the North Tahoe Event Center and a volunteer firefighter with the North Tahoe Fire District. On Aug. 22, the Placer County Sheriff's Office, Placer County Deputy Sheriff's Association, and the 1035 Foundation will be present to dedicate the field and play a benefit softball game. The community is invited to attend the ceremony, which begins at 10 a.m., and the game following. The Placer County Deputy Sheriff's Association will come together for an annual work day each year to assist with maintenance of the field and host an annual fundraiser/charity game or tournament. In addition, the PCDSA has purchased a new scoreboard for the field with the new name and a plaque.
